



# Vehicle Registration Driver License Exemption

When registering a vehicle, all registered owners of the vehicle must present an unexpired Washington driver license unless they meet one of the following requirements:

- Washington resident who does not operate a motor vehicle on public roads
- Driver license has been confiscated, suspended, or revoked
- Not available—out of the area, state, or country
- Incarcerated
- Divorcee who was not awarded the vehicle
- Deceased

Exempt from driver licensing requirements:

- Member of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, or National Guard, if licensed by the military to operate military vehicles
- Nonresident who is at least 16 with a valid driver license from their home state or country
- Nonresident who is at least 15 with a valid instruction permit from their home state or country and is accompanied by a licensed driver with at least 5 years of driving experience, who must sit beside the permit holder
- Anyone operating special highway construction equipment, a farm tractor, or a locomotive on rails
