



Intent to Seek Deferred Prosecution

If you plan to ask the court for a deferred prosecution for an alcohol or drug-related offense, you can use this form to request Department of Licensing (DOL) postpone suspending or revoking your driver license.

The postponement, also called a stay, lasts no longer than 150 days after the charges are filed in court or two years after the arrest date, whichever is shorter. The stay does not apply to a commercial driver license disqualification.

Step 1 – Confirm your eligibility

To qualify for a stay, you must have taken a breath or blood test at the time of your arrest. If you qualify, we will notify you by mail.
