Reasons supporting proposal: In accordance with RCW 43.24.086, we are required to set these fees "at a sufficient level to defray the costs of administering that program." After completing an account audit with the federal Appraiser Subcommittee (ASC), DOL identified an error in the program fund balance. To bring the program balance to good standing, DOL must increase program fees. The appraiser program has not had a fee increase since 2009 (15 years). Current fees are insufficient to sustain this program with cost of business increases. Fee increases are needed to continue providing the information
